Parking is an auxiliary unit, funded by parking permits. The free lots (500 series) were created in 1998. The agreement at that time was PTS will provide free parking for students as long as they pay the parking and transportation fee. This money pays the shuttles, etc. Currently, students and employees who purchase permits are subsidizing the people who are not paying for parking at all.

\$21 a month for the 500 series for employees, which is about \$100 a semester (if approved by the regents) and will be adding a pay station in 500 series for visitors. Fall 2020 is when this would start.

A consultant did come in and access the parking model we are using, and they gave positive feedback. Boulder has a model where you apply for a spot in a lottery to park near your building. The model based on pay (tiered costs) doesn't make the most sense because the wear and tear on a lot is the same no matter how much you make. Essential personnel get free parking on snow days.

Molly asked if we could have something written that people can read (FAQ) that would go out through the communique for awareness. Anna Squires recommended working with Jared to word smith this. Anna will follow up with Jim to work on communication. This message shouldn't come from SAEB but crafted with the communication marketing office and sent out campus wide.

Parking passes are sold 3 to 1 meaning for each space we sell three parking permits to allow for "in and out" parking. Faculty/Staff only parking wouldn't work for our revenue model.

Will the new budget model change parking? When we move to the new incentive model, will parking budget change? Since they are an auxiliary, they wouldn't think anything would change. Student enrollment would be the only thing that would change their budget.
